Edith Reeves Crain 101 of Ashland KY died Tuesday July 8, 2014 at the Kings Daughters and Sons Home for Senior Living. She was born April 14, 1913 in Denton KY the daughter of the late Frank and Corrida Holbrook Reeves. She attended a one room school house at Straight Creek KY, attended Junior High School, going on to become a certified teacher after graduating from Ashland High School and the University of Kentucky in 1932. She was a former teacher at Antioch and Dry Ridge in Carter Co. KY in 1941. She was a Women's Army Signal Core veteran during WWII serving in Military Intelligence at Arlington VA for three years. In addition to her parents she was also preceded in death by her husband Charles T. Crain who she married in 1952 and a brother Sherman Reeves. Survivors include relatives and my close knit community at Kings Daughters and Sons where she lived since June 2004 including neighbor Bob Felty, staff and fellow residents.
