January 7, 1920 - January 28, 2017

M. Kathryn Holt, age 97, died Saturday, January 28, 2017, at her home that she shared with her daughter and son-in-law. She was born January 7, 1920, in Seymour, Indiana, and was the daughter of Tyra Glenn Dollens and Zola D. Wadsworth Dollens. She worked for many years as an office manager for various oil companies, mostly in Southern Illinois. Her last working years were spent as head accountant/bookkeeper for the State Tuberculosis Sanitarium in Mt. Vernon, IL. She was born in Southern IN, but spent most of her life from her teenage years forward in Mt. Vernon, IL, where she was an active member of the Elks Club. In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her three husbands, Verl Thompson Skinner (father of her youngest daughter), Stewart Matthew Chambers (father of her two oldest daughters), and William "Dub" Holt. Her oldest daughter, Susan Elizabeth Chambers Berner, and her brother, James Riley Dollens, also preceded her in death. She is survived by two daughters, Lana Jean Skinner White (Freddy) of Ashland, KY, and Christine Chambers White (Larry) of Elmhurst, IL; one sister, Delores Dollens Render (Ret. Col. Charles) of Clarksville, TN; her son-in law Robert Frank Berner of Olympia Fields, IL; six grandchildren, Lara, Aaron, Jenna, Michael, Julie, and Steven; and eight great-grandchildren. She was an inspiration for all who knew and loved her, demonstrating to her blended family a style of both grit and grace. Her sharp mind allowed her to keep meticulous and accurate account books for her home until the day she died. Her close friend, Linda Newsome, lovingly cared for her for four years until her

passing. Kathryn and Linda described themselves as “Peas and Carrots!” In accordance with her wishes, there are no services scheduled at this time, but friends and family will gather sometime soon in Chicago, IL, the city she loved best, to celebrate her long life that spanned from the Roaring Twenties to the election of President Donald Trump.
