Paul Preston McConnell, 81, of Ashland, died Tuesday, September 25, 2018 at Kings Daughters Medical Center. He was born April 6, 1937 in Ashland, the son of the late Lon and Zelda Loar McConnell. He was retired from the Department of Justice, Federal Bureau of Prisons. He was a member of Centenary United Methodist Church, where he served as Trustee and drove the church van and was a U.S. Army veteran, stationed in Germany.
