



## Virginia Clarys Taylor

August 19, 1925 - March 1, 2015

Virginia Clarys Thomas Taylor, 89 of Maysville, KY formerly of Ashland, KY died peacefully at Meadowview Regional Medical Center in Maysville, KY on March 1, 2015 following an extended illness. Born in New Boston, OH on August 19, 1925, Virginia or “Ginnie” to the many that loved her, lived most of her life in Ashland, KY and never lived more than five miles from the Ohio River her entire life. She will be reunited with her beloved husband, James Leslie Taylor. They raised four children in Ashland, KY and celebrated 51 years of marriage together before his passing in 1994 at the age of 73. Her grandchildren and great grandchildren remember her as an expert at quilting, crafting collectible Christmas ornaments, making delicious sweet tea and baking snicker doodle cookies.
